Oxford Fellowship in Foot and Ankle Surgery

The Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre is a teaching hospital in the Oxford University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust. It provides a service for the clinical management of all musculoskeletal problems, with Orthopaedics, Rheumatology, Sports Medicine, Rehabilitation and Medical Imaging. There are 196 beds on 5 orthopaedic wards, the bone infection unit, HDU, 8 operating theatres and a day surgery unit.

The Fellowship aims to complete the competences to be a specialist Consultant Foot & Ankle Surgeon. The Fellow will usually be attached to Mr Bob Sharp & Mr Rick Brown, with sub-specialty experience in complex hindfoot arthritis, ankle replacement, adolescent orthopaedics and neuro-muscular disorders. Depending on the learning goals of our Fellow, they could alternatively work for Mr Mark Rogers & Mr Con Loizou to gain additional experience in the management of the complex diabetic foot and bone infection.

The Fellow has traditionally completed CCT and a previous F&A Fellowship elsewhere so this will be the final preparation for Consultant practice. Therefore we operating as the first surgeon and encourage independent operating lists.

The Fellow will be expected to lead an audit, or service improvement; while carrying forward a project in the research programme. We work closely with NDORMS (Nuffield department of Orthopaedic, Rheumatology and Musculoskeletal Science, University of Oxford. They regularly lecture and examine the Medical students. The Fellow co-ordinates the monthly journal club.

The full-time post is for 6 months, but is often extended by mutual agreement to 12 months. Before Covid, the Fellow was on-call for our elective site (1 in 13 approx). Salary scale: MN37 plus on call supplement.
