Vivek Dhukaram (Course Director)

Vivek Dhukaram is a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon with subspecialist interest in foot and ankle surgery based at University Hospitals Coventry & Warwickshire NHS trust (UHCW). He was trained and accredited as an Orthopaedic Surgeon from South Trent training scheme. He undertook advanced fellowship training from Nottingham and RNOH Stanmore and also awarded British Orthopaedic Foot and Ankle Society and European Foot and Ankle Society travelling fellowships. He has set up the specialist Foot and Ankle service at University hospitals Coventry and Warwickshire and continues to develop it. Vivek regularly teaches in the national and international courses. He examines for the FRCS Orth and international FRCS Orth and currently serves on the Education committee BOFAS.



Iain Bissell

lain Bissell studied medicine at St. Bartholomew's Hospital, London. His orthopaedic training was in Oxford and Southampton then completed with fellowships in limb construction then foot and ankle surgery. In 2006 he was appointed as the first Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Surgeon in Hereford. He developed the service, including forming & leading the Diabetic Foot Team. He has been an award winning Clinical Director for the department. Then Associate Medical Director for Productivity across three Trusts. He has sat on the Local Negotiating Committee for >10 years. Currently is Job Planning Lead for Hereford. He has a particular interest in equitable, productive and fair job plans.



Anna Chapman

Anna Chapman is a Consultant Trauma and Orthopaedic Surgeon at University Hospitals, Coventry and Warwickshire, with a specialist interest in Foot and Ankle surgery. She qualified from Guy's, King's and St. Thomas's Hospitals School of Medicine in London and completed her Orthopaedic training on the Warwick rotation. She undertook Fellowship training in Bournemouth and Bristol and was appointed as a Consultant in 2012. She completed a Masters Degree in Medical Education at the University of Warwick in 2010 and continues to pursue her interest in all things educational. Anna is currently the Lead Training Programme Director for the West Midlands and is a member of the Specialist Advisory Committee. Mark B Davies

Mark B Davies is a graduate of Southampton University from 1993 who subsequently underwent specialist training in Sheffield. He undertook two Fellowships, one in trauma and limb reconstruction in Sheffield and the other in adult foot and ankle surgery in Brisbane in 2005. He is a consultant and honorary clinical lecturer in the Sheffield Foot and Ankle Unit, the lead for undergraduate education in orthopaedic surgery and the SFAU lead for research and audit. Mark has served two terms as BOFAS Honorary Secretary and is the current BOFAS President.

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Yaser Ghani

Yaser Ghani is a Consultant Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle surgeon working at the Homerton University Hospital. He completed his undergraduate training at UCL in London and completed his specialty training in London (Stanmore rotation). He undertook Foot & Ankle fellowships in Windsor, St. Marys's London and Oxford. He has a special interest in complex foot and ankle deformity, ankle arthritis (including replacements) and complex foot and ankle trauma.

He is actively involved in research, education and initiated the BOFAS 'Lectures of Distinction' Webinar series with the BOFAS Educational Committee and became the first non-consultant to become part of the BOFAS Education Committee.



Annabel Hayward

Annabel Hayward is a consultant in NHS Lanarkshire in the West of Scotland. She has a subspecialty interest in Foot and Ankle and Paediatrics. Annabel graduated from the University of Aberdeen in 2009 and completed her Trauma and Orthopaedic training in the West of Scotland. Annabel undertook fellowship training in Glasgow and Manchester and commenced her current post as a Consultant in Trauma and Orthopaedic Surgery in August 2022.



Venu Kavarthapu

Venu Kavarthapu completed his higher surgical training in Trauma and Orthopaedics from southeast Thames rotation before his appointment as a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon in King's College Hospital, London in 2006. In addition to providing adult foot and ankle service, he established the functional limb salvage Charcot foot reconstruction service at King's multidisciplinary diabetic foot unit that is recognised nationally. He lectures nationally and internationally and established the 'Multidisciplinary and Surgical Reconstruction of Charcot Foot' symposium and 'Charcot Foot Reconstruction Cadaver Workshop' in London. He is actively involved in research and published several scientific articles in foot and ankle. His other responsibilities include associate professor, University of Southern Denmark, associate editor Journal of Clinical Orthopaedics and Trauma. He is the immediate past-president International Association.



Nilesh Makwana

Nilesh Makwana is from Birmingham and qualified from St George's Hospital Medical School, University of London in 1989. He completed his specialist registrar training in the Trent region and was appointed Consultant Trauma & Orthopaedic surgeon at the Robert Jones & Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital, Shropshire and the Betsi Cadwaldr University Health Board in 2001. He is a Specialist Foot and Ankle Surgeon treating all conditions of the adult foot and ankle. His area of expertise include forefoot surgery, mid and hindfoot reconstruction and arthroscopy. He has developed a specialist interest in Autologous Chondrocyte transplantation in the ankle.



Giles Pattison

Giles graduated from University College London in 1991. His surgical training was in Bristol. Having completed his fellowship training at SickKids in Toronto he was appointed to a consultant post at University Hospitals Coventry and Warwickshire in 2005. He completed a masters in medical education at the University of Warwick. Giles has been TPD of the Warwick programme and is currently a member of the SAC. He has served as departmental chair and Head of Surgery. Giles has a wide ranging paediatric practice, which includes trauma, with an increasing numbers of children with foot disorders.

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Hiro Tanaka

Hiro Tanaka is a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon in Newport, South Wales. He is passionate about improving the quality of surgical training and promoting clinical leadership in the NHS. He designed the BOFAS Principles Course on behalf of the Education Committee in 2010 and continues to be a member of the committee. He is Chairman of the Education and Revalidation Committee of the BOA and is an examiner for the FRCS (Orth). Hiro is the current BOFAS Treasurer.



Tim Williams

Tim Williams graduated from Guy's and St. Thomas' Medical School in 1999, completed his surgical training in London and East Anglia before undertaking his fellowship training at the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital. He was appointed as Consultant Foot and Ankle Surgeon at Colchester in 2011. Here he has established a working and educational relationship with the British army garrison, supporting the Regional Rehabilitation Unit.

His education interests include training junior doctors as well as allied healthcare practitioners and he has taught on the Oxbridge theatre personnel course.

Tim is a member of the BOFAS Education Committee and Overseas Sub-Committee.



Aureola Tong

Aurey is a graduate of Guy's, King's and St Thomas' School of Medicine. She completed junior training in London, Oxford and Swindon before starting her registrar training on the Wales rotation in 2007. After a decade of training less than full time (and three kids later), a MSc in Orthopaedic Engineering, then full time fellowships in Paediatric orthopaedics (Cardiff) and Foot and Ankle Surgery (Bristol), she joined Royal Glamorgan Hospital (part of Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Healthboard) as a Consultant in 2020. Jonathan Young was appointed at UHCW in July 2012 having completed his specialist registrar training as part of the Warwick programme and fellowships in Trauma/Limb Reconstruction and Foot and Ankle surgery. He has been the Trauma Lead within the T&O department in July 2013 and concomitantly the Major Trauma Governance lead for the trust in 2014. In 2017 he was appointed to CD for T&O and in 2019 was appointed to be Group CD for the division of Trauma and Neuro Services. From 2024, he was appointed as CMO of UHCW. He has a subspecialty interest in all foot and ankle trauma and open fractures.
